Dear Parents and Carers.

The festive cheer is well and truly in full swing here! I love hearing the sound of children singing Christmas songs and preparing for their performances. Key stage one children performed their first production yesterday and it was great to see how confident some of our youngest pupils were and how hard the whole staff team have worked, to ensure that everyone remembered their lines and learnt all the words to the various songs. If you haven't been to watch yet, you are in for a real treat. We also have Reception's first production on Monday morning, which again, you will observe high levels of confidence. A great way to end the autumn term.

As you know, we continue to work hard with our families, with regards to attendance and punctuality. This is a reminder to emphasise the importance of being in school on time as there have been incidents of some families routinely arriving at school after 9.00am or later, without prior arrangement. Children in key stage two need to be in school by 8.40am and children in reception and key stage one by 8.50am. The school gates do open ten minutes prior to these times and all children are invited into their classes from this time with work and tasks to complete. Children who arrive late to school are disadvantaged because they miss starting the day with their peers and the beginning of lessons. This means that they are often unsettled and confused about tasks. Punctuality is a life skill that children need to develop whilst they are young. It is essential that you ensure that your child arrives at school on time to prevent disruption to your child's own learning and that of others. We will continue to focus on this area with children through class work and our school assemblies. We are required to monitor children's punctuality and attendance. On-going lateness is classified as an unauthorised absence and parents/carers will be contacted directly if this continues to be a problem.

As we finish the autumn term, I would like to take a moment to bid farewell to one of our dedicated teaching assistants who has been an integral part of our school community for many years. Mrs. Hughes, who has been with us for a considerable amount of time, is embarking on a new chapter in her life as she re-enters her previous world of being an Optometrist. We are grateful for her years of service and wish her all the best in her new role.



Thank you so much to all our parents, families and supporters as we have been informed that a total of £915.85 was raised through the Asda Cashpot for Schools. Friends of Callands will be consulting with ParentKind on how this money will be received and hopefully this will contribute significantly to the next project Friends of Callands are working on, to benefit all our pupils.
