Democracy	Within lessons, pupils have the opportunity to contribute to discussions, have their opinions heard, view other children's work and give them feedback. Pupils are encouraged to allow everyone to have their say on particular topics and also how to present different pieces of work.	
Rule of Law	Pupils are taught about the implications of posting negative comments on social media and also the implications of cyber bullying. Pupils are taught how to use the Internet safely, at school and at home, and how to report any images/messages deemed to be inappropriate. Pupils are taught about how to leave a positive digital footprint and how this may affect them in later life.	
Individual Liberty	Pupils are encouraged to make choices in the knowledge they are in a safe and supportive environment. The school provides boundaries for pupils to make choices safely.	
Mutual Respect for and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs	When using the Internet to research different faiths and beliefs, children are encouraged to show levels of respect. Pupils are taught about their etiquette online and how to positively engage in an online community.
